Evacuation Triage Team (ETT) Training

Purpose:

To ensure participants understand how and where to send evacuees, based upon their medical needs/conditions, utilizing the Evacuation Triage Team (ETT) model.

Target Audience:

- Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Members
- Public Safety Officials (Fire/EMS)
- Emergency Management Personnel (Those responsible for mass care, sheltering, evacuation)
- · Public Health Officials
- Local Governmental Officials (i.e. City Managers, Mayor, Council Members)
- Local Non-Governmental Organizations
- Mass Transit Leadership/Personnel
- Healthcare Liaisons (Hospitals and Community Support Services)
- Medical Reserve Corp Members
- · Disaster Medical Team members
- Disability Groups/Organizations

Course Objectives:

- Explain how to assess medical needs during the evacuation process.
- Determine appropriate mode of transportation to shelter site.
- Understand shelter site capabilities/limitations and determining appropriate shelter site.
- Illustrate the examples of embarkation hub setup and flow of evacuees throughout the triage process.
- Discuss the two types of systems utilized for tracking of evacuees to and from sites.

Course content:

- ETT System:
 - Identification of medical conditions of evacuees to determine appropriate shelter placement as well as medical care needed during evacuation and sheltering.
 - o Assignment of evacuees to appropriate facilities.
 - Determination of type of transport needed and understanding of transport capabilities.
 - o Ensuring resources are utilized efficiently and appropriately.

- How to utilize technology in the ETT setting:
 - Pulsara Tracking System
 - Texas Emergency Tracking Network (TxETN)
 - o Texas PULSE System
 - WebEOC Tracking Board
